Title	Netball Coach (including Junior and Mentor Coaches)
Position Summary	<p>To promote the enjoyment of, and participation in netball, of all players</p> <p>To ensure skill development of netball players through training sessions that are engaging, age appropriate and challenging</p> <p>Develop player's understanding and knowledge of the game of netball</p> <p>Be a role model for all players at Essendon Netball Club</p> <p>Coaching Mentor</p> <p>As above, but also:</p> <p>Mentor Essendon Netball Club Junior Coaches</p> <p>Junior Coach</p> <p>As above, but also:</p> <p>To learn the nuances of coaching a netball team</p> <p>Reflect on feedback provided by the Head Coach and Mentor, so that your coaching practices improve and develop</p>
Key duties and responsibilities	<p>With support from the Head Coach, work with other coaching staff to grade players into teams</p> <p>Teach players how to play netball eg know the rules, and how to interpret these rules in game play</p> <p>Teach the skills necessary to participate safely and effectively in a game of netball</p> <p>Plan and run all training sessions for your allocated team</p> <p>Continually evaluate the efficacy of training sessions, so that as the players' motor skills develop with age, so too does skill development</p> <p>Provide an environment that encourages player confidence which in turn leads to greater skill development, tactical awareness, teamwork and enjoyment of the game</p> <p>Determine player positions on game day</p> <p>Equally rotate players on/off the ground during the season</p> <p>On match days, ensure all players play at least three quarters (¾) of the game (unless the player is injured or declines)</p> <p>Be a role model for your team – demonstrate good sportsmanship, and be aware of Netball Victoria and Essendon Netball Club Codes of Conduct and behavioural standards</p> <p>Attend monthly meetings with the Head Coach</p> <p>Work alongside, and communicate with your Team Manager so that your team operates effectively eg game schedules, Team App notifications etc</p> <p>Hold the appropriate coaching accreditation</p> <p>Ensure you have a valid Working With Children's Check (WWC). Provide this to the Head Coach and Secretary</p> <p>Be accountable to the Head Coach and Committee</p> <p>Attend the Annual General Meeting (AGM)</p> <p><i>Continued next page</i></p>

Coaching Mentor

In addition to the above, Mentors will:

Provide support to Junior Coaches at training and on game day eg provide training/game day plans, assist with player positioning etc

Demonstrate an understanding of the game of netball, and impart this knowledge onto the Junior Coach, thus ensuring the Junior Coach is able to teach the rules of the game to their players. This includes knowledge of how to interpret the rules in a game situation

Support Junior Coaches in match play decision making processes eg player positioning, tactical awareness etc, so that the coach and team are in the best position to experience success

Provide Junior Coaches with feedback that is constructive and motivating, so that they feel empowered to improve their coaching skills/abilities both in a training and game day setting

On game day, Mentor Coaches must wear a blue vest as per EDNA guidelines

Be accountable to the Head Coach and Committee

Junior Coach

In addition to the above, Junior coaches will:

Implement training session plans developed by the Head Coach and/or Mentor, when conducting training sessions with your team

As experience and confidence grows, work with the Head Coach and/or Mentor to develop your own training and game day plans for your team

If practicable, attend and participate in any coaching courses recommended by the Head Coach/Mentor, to further enhance your coaching skill and ability. These courses will be endorsed by the Club Committee

Be accountable to the Head Coach and Mentor
